Age Groups	<ul> <li>Players should have reached the relevant age by January 1st of the year in which the tournament is held.</li> <li>Therefore for a player to play in an age category +35</li> </ul>	
	to +70 age group they need to have been born in or before the year shown in the chart above.	
	Note: if there are less than five entries in a given event of age group, the right is reserved to cancel that event of age group. If this happens, the players who have entered the cancelled age group will be eligible to enter the same event in lower age group, provided that there are entry spaces available.	
Draw sizes in Group play	If the age category event is played on knock out basis, there will be a maximum main draw size of 32. If entries allow it, events may be played in groups.	
	Where entries are less in an age category event, the event may be played on a league format and the distribution as follows:	
	• 1 – 5 entries - One group	
	<ul> <li>6 – 10 entries - Two Groups - top two players in a group shall qualify to the Semi Finals of a knock out draw</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>11 – 16 entries Four Groups - top two players in the group will qualify to the Quarter finals of a knock out draw.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>17 and above entries will be played in a knock out draw format.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>If there are more than 32 players, qualifying rounds might be played, at the discretion of the Referee.</li> </ul>	
	The Committee of Management shall decide on the above, if sufficient courts are available.	
	The entries will be made on a first come first serve basis. So to avoid disappointment, please send your entries through your National Associations as soon as possible.	

Entries	Each Member Association shall be entitled to enter in each age group, up to 4 men and 4 women in singles events, 8 men and 8 women in level doubles events, and 4 men and 4 women in mixed doubles event.
	<ol> <li>Singles – 4 males + 4 females</li> <li>Doubles – 8 males + 8 females</li> <li>Mixed – 4 males + 4 females</li> </ol>
	A player can compete in not more than one singles, one doubles and one mixed doubles event in any eligible age group. E.g. a male player eligible in 45+ age category, can enter in 45+ Men's Singles, then he will not be eligible to play in Men's Singles event in any other age group.
	Note: Passports will be checked against date of birth in BWF headquarters and also by the Referees at the venue against the original copy of Passport. 	Players must possess BWF ID numbers to submit their online entries. Players without BWF ID numbers are requested to contact your National Association to obtain BWF ID Numbers through online ID system. In the online entry system players CANNOT make a request as "Partner Wanted". Players who are keen to partner a player from different Member Association in the doubles event are requested to contact their Member Association sufficiently in advance for approval before the closing date. Entries will not be accepted if a Member Association's 2017 subscription has not been paid or their National Association is suspended by BWF.
